- On Sunday at 2:00 PM there will be a **group photoshoot** in sports hall A. Additionally, photographers will be taking pictures throughout the tournament.
- Eulevoto 2026 is organized exclusively by volunteers. Members of the **organizing team** are identified by T-shirts and are available as points of contact. Please be patient and respectful—we are doing our best to address all your requests as quickly as possible.
- Please do your bit to help create an **inclusive and safe space for all athletes** – women, lesbians, trans, inter, non-binary and agender. Treat each other with respect and observe fair play during the games. This includes treating the referees, opposing teams, and the organizing team with respect. Let's have a great tournament and a good time. If you do, however, experience or witness any inappropriate behaviour, please report it to members of the organizing team immediately and without hesitation.

Game mode Level A and B+

There are twelve teams in Level A/B+. Each team plays exactly eight matches – five on Saturday and three on Sunday.

On Saturday, levels A and B+ start with a joint group stage comprising two groups of six (groups A and B). Within the groups, each team plays against every other team. According to the rankings, the top three teams in each group will progress to Level A, and the bottom three to Level B+.

On Sunday, level A continues with two groups of three (groups F and G). Within the groups, each team plays against every other team. The ranking will be followed by the placement matches between the teams tied for the same position in the two groups.

On Sunday, Level B+ also continues with two groups of three (groups H and J). Within the groups, each team plays against every other team. The ranking will be followed by the placement matches between the teams tied for the same position in the two groups.

There are twelve teams in Level B-. Each team plays exactly eight matches – five on Saturday and three on Sunday.

On Saturday, level B- starts with a group stage comprising two groups of six (groups C and D). Within the groups, each team plays against every other team. According to the rankings, the top three teams in each group will progress to groups K and L, and the bottom three to groups M and N on Sunday. Within the new groups, each team plays against every other team. The ranking will be followed by the placement matches between the teams tied for the same position in groups K and L, and M and N.

Tournament rules

The normal volleyball rules apply. When something is not clear, **the referee is always right**.

We play **on time**. Each match consists of two sets of each 15 minutes. There is a 10-minute warm-up period before each match. Please note that you may need to change halls between matches! If a team is more than 5 minutes late, the set is recorded as a 0-25 loss.

There will be a **signal** to announce the end of a set and the end of a match. At the change-courts signal you stop playing immediately, meaning you don't finish the rally. You change courts and start the second set. At the end signal you again stop playing immediately.

Each team is allowed to ask for **one time out per set** (30 seconds), but not in the last five minutes.

Official match balls will be provided. Teams are free to use other balls as well, provided both sides agree.

When your team has **referee duty**, you provide a referee, linespeople and a score keeper. Please note that in Level C (Group E), teams may occasionally be required to provide referees for two courts at the same time!

You get **2 points** for a set you won and **1 point** when the score is equal at the signal. In each match you can therefore get 0, 1, 2, 3 or 4 points.

In levels A/B+ and B-, after the first group stage is finished on Saturday, we make **the ranking** for the second group phase on Sunday. The ranking is determined by the number of set points won. In the event of a tie, the tiebreaker is the overall point difference. If the tie persists, the head-to-head record is used. If the tie persists, the team with more overall points is ranked higher. If all else fails, a coin will be tossed.

Once the (second) group stage has concluded across all levels on Sunday, the **placement matches** will follow. Places 3–11 will again be played on time. In the event of a tie after the final signal of the second set, a further deciding point will be played.

The finals are a best-of-three match. You play two sets until 25. In case of 1-1 in sets, there will be a third set until 15 points.
